## **Veterinary Nursing Assistant** Qualification

This Level 2 pre-veterinary nursing qualification for veterinary nursing assistants provides a pathway to veterinary nursing.

#### **Entry requirements**

There are no formal entry requirements for this course, although it is recommended that learners study for functional skills Level 2 Numeracy and Literacy if these, or equivalent, have not been achieved.

#### **Qualification delivery**

This qualification is delivered by Centres approved by Central Qualifications. For a full list of Centres, click here.

The programme will include a balance of practical learning and theoretical teaching. A relevant work placement is required to allow for the acquisition of skills and to enable students to become competent and confident in a veterinary environment.

#### Methods of learning

An estimated learning time of 570 hours is required and learners can

undertake this qualification on a full or part-time basis.

Practical learning comprising supervised experience in a clinical environment, coupled with theoretical teaching, ensures that learners develop a comprehensive understanding of the role, as well as the required practical competencies to be a veterinary nursing assistant.

#### Qualification structure

To achieve the full qualification, learners must complete six mandatory and two optional units.

Mandatory units of study:

- Maintain and develop personal performance
- Principles and practices of administrative duties in the veterinary care environment
  Companion animal anatomy and physiology
- Principles and practices of animal handling and care in the veterinary environment
- Principles of infection control for animal nursing assistants
- Principles of supporting veterinary nursing care for hospitalised animals

Mandatory units of study:

- Practical support of veterinary nursing care for hospitalised patients
- Practical support of peri-operative animal nursing
- Practical animal nursing support of small animal patients

#### Assessment

Learners are required to complete a series of assignments, examinations and clinical skills assessments when studying for the Diploma for Veterinary Nursing Assistants; these are graded as pass or fail and learners are required to pass all assessments to achieve the qualification.

Learners will also compile a workbased online progress log (Central Skills Log).

#### Progression

The Diploma for Veterinary Nursing Assistants allows learners to progress onto the Diploma in Animal Nursing and the Diploma in Veterinary Nursing (Small Animal/Equine).
